




CANADIAN NATIONAL GP 40-2

The GP-40 is the most common locomotive in Canadian National's fleet, except for the GP-9. In 1982, CN had 267 units working across the country.


The GP 40-2s were purchased during the period 1974-76 from General Motors of Canada, Diesel Division in London, Ontario. The CN models, unlike models built in the U.S., were all equipped with the wide nose comfort cabs.

The high horsepower GP 40-2s have an interesting history. Generally, it was an unpopular model. Canadian National and the Chessie System were the only roads to purchase a great number of the units. There are a number of reasons for this situation. Railways complained of problems with the GP 40; they said it had poor traction. So, railways were reluctant to by its successor, the GP 40-2, even though the traction problems were corrected. The second reason for the poor sales was the fact that the railways found high power six axle units more reliable than the four axle GP 40s and GP 40-2s. So the GP 40-2 is an uncommon engine in North America. Although there are many on Canadian National rails, one is unlikely to see many elsewhere. Railfans looking for CN GP 40-2s will find them most often on main line freights.





Black and Grey Diagram




Orange Diagram

Box Cab 'Bash

It's time to bash some kits! Specifically, we're going to tear apart a Roundhouse Dummy Track Cleaner and an Athearn Hustler. For what purpose? To make a diminutive box cab diesel, and maybe get you interested in kitbashing. This project is pretty simple, which makes it great for those snowy days when your skis are in the shop.

MDC DUMMY TRACK CLEANER MODIFICATIONS

As you will only need the bodyshell, discard the chassis and track cleaning equipment. From the left-hand side of the shell measure in 56mm. Then measure 10mm from that point. Cut out and discard this portion of the shell. Simple, huh?

ATHEARN HUSTLER MODIFICATIONS

With the Hustler, separate the bodyshell from the chassis and discard. If this project is becoming an impossibility, take a break.

PURE PERFORMANCE


A lot of people have complained about the Hustler's poor performance. North West Short Line has remedied this situation by offering a new motor for the Hustler. According to the Guy In The Hobby Shop, one must build a frame for the motor so it can fit into the chassis. He suggested using Plastruct pieces. N.W.S.L. can provide better instructions with the purchase of the motor.


THE (ANTI)CLIMAX

Take the modified M.D.C. bodyshell and add any superdetailing parts you wish (i.e. grab irons, etc.). Paint and decal the shell. Attach the bodyshell to the Hustler chassis/N.W.S.L. frame. That's it.

** NOTE ** If the author sounded sarcastic throughout any part of this article, just ignore him - he's weird.




