CANADIAN REGION consists of all Canadian Provinces.

NORTHEASTERN REGION consists of the following states: Maine, New Hampshire, Connecticut, New York, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Vermont, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, West Virginia, Virginia, Delaware.

INTERNATIONAL REGION consists of all countries other than Canada and the United States.

CENTRAL REGION consists of the following states: North Dakota, South Dakota, Minnesota, Wisconsin, Michigan, Nebraska, Iowa, Illinois, Indiana, Ohio, Kansas, Missouri, Kentucky.

SOUTHERN REGION consists of the following states: Oklahoma, Arkansas, Tennessee, North Carolina, Texas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia, South Carolina, Florida.

WESTERN REGION consists of the following states: Washington, Idaho, Montana, Oregon, Wyoming, California, Nevada, Utah, Colorado, Arizona, New Mexico, Alaska and Hawaii.

The TAMR has developed regions to bring the association to you on a more local level. Many of our regions are active holding meets and railfanning trips within their boundaries as well as publishing their own newsletters (these are available at a slight extra cost). In addition, our regions have developed a number of model railroad systems which you can join. These systems help to link up members' railroads throughout the region and extend the "beyond the basement" concept by introducing interchanges. These interchanges can be real or imagined between various system members. **INTERNATIONAL REGION:** Handles all TAMR members living outside of Canada and the United States. Contact the regional representative on the newsletter.

**NORTHEASTERN REGION:** Newsletter--DEPOT. Issued six times a year; \$5.00. Contact regional representative for subscription information. Model railroad system is NEST: Northeastern Shortlines & Terminals. Information on NEST from the region rep.

**SOUTHERN REGION:** Newsletter-- CRESCENT. Its publication schedule is not known at this time.

**WESTERN REGION:** Newsletter--DAYLIGHT : issued quarterly. A subscription is \$3.50. Write Claude Morelli, Their model railroad system is WARS: Western Association of Railroads & Shortlines. Information on WARS can be obtained from Dan Carroll,
